Dear Parents:

State law allows high school students with a grade point average of at least 2.5, in good academic standing, and who are citizens of the U.S. or Legal Permanent Resident of the U.S., to serve as poll workers, if they are at least 16 years of age. All students that are placed will be required to attend a two hour training class prior to Election Day.

Students will serve with 3 or 4 other members of the election board. The hours are long. The student is expected to be at the polling place at 6:00 am and may not be released until 9:00 pm. Students are responsible for providing their own transportation to and from the polling place. Assigned polling places are in close proximity to the home or school. Students are paid the same as other poll workers - \$130 for Election Day and an additional \$35 for attending a training class. Paychecks are mailed 3-5 weeks following the election.

Your child will benefit from this program in several ways:

- Hands-on experience of learning how local elections are conducted
- Receive training on how to open a polling place, process voters and close the polls
- Inspiration to register and vote when they reach 18 years of age
- Gain a lifelong appreciation for the democratic process
- Receive satisfaction of playing an active and important role in their community

In order to be considered for this program, your child must complete the attached nomination form and meet the requirements and deadline. The teacher will send the forms to the Registrar of Voters Office. All students who submit a nomination form will be placed.

If your child would like to be considered for the Student Poll Worker Program for the upcoming election, please have him/her and a parent fill out the Nomination Form. The nomination form must be returned to the teacher for transmittal to the Registrar of Voters Office. If for some reason your child is unable to participate, please advise our office immediately. We look forward to your child's participation!
